Dear Parents/Guardians,



The Office of Catholic Schools has asked that each of its schools send out the Student Absentee Policy. As a whole, public and private schools are noticing an increase in student absences from school, as well as high levels of tardiness. Students cannot learn if they are not in attendance, they get behind in their work, and become overwhelmed with trying to get caught up again. This often leads to increases in depression or anxiety. It becomes a vicious cycle. At St. Gilbert our calendar has 180 days of school, 10% of that would be 18 days, 18 days divided by 3 trimesters would mean that we are paying attention to absences that are over 6 days in a trimester and are not the result of a medical reason. Per our handbook, we ask that vacations try to be scheduled around school closures for; summer, holidays and spring break if possible. <u>Student Attendance Policy</u>

Save Our Saint Gilbert Scholarships!

The Invest in Kids Act which grants tax credits to people who fund scholarships that allow Illinois students from low-income families to attend private schools is slated to sunset Dec. 31 unless state legislators approve an extension.

Last year, 25 Saint Gilbert School students received scholarships, and statewide, over 9,000 students of working class families received the same gift. If the program ends, many of these children will be forced to leave their "best fit" schools, causing trauma and ending the hopes and dreams of students and their families.

How can I help?

We have a chance to save the program this fall but we need you to contact your legislator with a personal message directed through <u>www.savemyscholarship.org</u> or use the QR code on the flier below. Personalize the message so our representatives know that the email is from a real voter – tell them you're from Saint Gilbert School and why the program is important for helping students in need.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I want to formally thank all of you for your efforts towards our major school fundraiser-our Boosterthon "Fun Run." We had a school goal of \$40,000 which we surpassed! Our estimate in profit is \$47,000. We have 53 submissions to corporate matching that would add an additional \$6,000.

Some other interesting statistics are as follows:

82% of students registered 76% of students had at least (1) pledge We received pledges from (33) of the (50) states Grandparent giving totaled \$17,000 Relative giving totaled \$13,000 Parental giving totaled \$23,000 Family friend giving totaled \$7,000

I always like to focus on results that you can see. We have just "scored" an end of season clearance deal on a "Greenhouse" for our school vegetable garden. For those of you who do not have 4th graders yet, we have a community garden where plants are started from seed over the winter/spring and then planted by 4th grade students as part of the study of plant cycles in Science. The garden grows all summer with the help of Ms. Bishop, 4th Grade Science teacher, and Mrs. Kozak, 2nd grade aide, and then food is harvested and given to the Avon Food Pantry. I want to thank both Mr. & Mrs. Kozak for finding the "deal" and their offer of assembly and ground preparation! We will see this project completed in the next couple of weeks.

I have been researching a popular recess game called "Gaga Ball." We would like to purchase additional games for our students at recess. A Gaga Ball pit can accommodate 15-20 children and is a safer variant of traditional dodgeball. I will also be purchasing recess playground stencils which we will use to add games such as hopscotch and four square to the parking lot area. I have asked Mrs. Bocox & Mr. Keeler to do an inventory of gym equipment and to give me a list of any additional items that they need to enhance our PE classes. We will feature each new item purchased with your donations, on our school website and social media. Again, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your generosity.

Boosterthon as an organization is the coordinator of this fundraiser, but I do want to thank some of our volunteers for being onsite during the event, and for helping to hand out prizes during the duration of our event. Thank you to Mrs. Murphy (dress down pass creator), Mrs. Teipel (Prize Coordinator), Mrs.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

This past weekend we held our 9th Annual Golf Outing. It was a lovely sunny afternoon of golf with friends, family, and SGS supporters. I want to thank Mr. Rivera for all his hard work putting this outing together. It is purely his belief in volunteering to help a cause, and his love of golf, that created the tradition of this "outing." This is not expected as part of the Athletic Director duties. Next year I would like to grow this fundraiser to include an entire school/parish focus, but I will need more people willing to volunteer their time for planning, organizing, and soliciting sponsors for that to happen. Thank you to our hole sponsors, and our volunteers; Virginia Biegel, Meaghen Dahm, Paula Rivera, Norie Kouba, Marisela Brum, Greg & Ashley Teipel, Jenny & Matt Van Wie (kids too), and our alumni/Carmel Catholic students.

SGS is an "Allergy Aware" school. In each classroom & the lunchroom is an envelope that contains specific allergy information for students. Lunch is eaten in a lunchroom with (3) grades together at long cafeteria tables. When there are classroom parties, lunch is eaten in the classroom. Room parents should consult with the teacher and reference the allergy list when planning the menus for parties. We respectfully request that no nut products be packaged in lunches. This includes any item that contains; peanuts, almonds, walnuts, pecans, etc. Allergy Aware means that we as a school are aware of the allergy and have systems in place to communicate with other adults supervising food. It also means that the children have been educated and are aware of how to protect themselves from potentially ingesting food that they might be allergic to. The main line of defense is that the children know not to share food, and that they eat their own lunch, and if old enough, carry an epi pen with them to the lunchroom. The nurse will also bring epi pens to the lunchroom daily if one has been provided to her. Our hot lunch provider Kiddos contracts with different restaurants to offer food options, they cannot guarantee that all items have been prepared away from nut products or were packaged in facilities where no nuts were present. Hot lunch is an option available, not a requirement.

Our Family School Association coordinates monthly "Restaurant Nights" throughout the year. FSA receives a percentage of the sales from the evening, and these funds are then used to help support the efforts of FSA. The entire staff want to thank FSA for the Target gift cards they received as a "Welcome back to School" that helped teachers to set-up their classrooms. Our first restaurant night will be Lou Malnati's on September 13th.

### August 21, 2023 Calendar Change Dismissal Notice

Fr. John has informed me that St. Gilbert Parish is one of only (3) Archdiocese of Chicago parishes that will host the visit of a relic of St. Jude the Apostle. The visit will take place on Tuesday September 12th, beginning at 1 PM, in the church, continuing with 7 PM Mass in honor of St Jude, and veneration continuing until 10 PM.

The relic, which is usually displayed at the parish church of San Salvatore in Lauro in central Rome, is on loan to various churches and shrines in this country through a special arrangement with the Vatican and the Vicariato di Roma, the local Church of the city of Rome. Fr. Carlos Martins accompanies the relic and oversees the visits, and will be here to celebrate the 7 PM Mass. We have been informed that there will be much interest in viewing this relic, and to expect visitors by the thousands. Due to the arrival of the relic and the expected increase in traffic and parking required to host a holy relic, Fr. John has asked that we dismiss the school children early on September 12th. We will be dismissing at 12:00, and we will not be having our normal lunch periods on that day to keep the students in their core classes longer. I have reached out to the bus companies to see if they could add an early dismissal to their routes, but have been told it is not possible. Please make this change to your school calendar at home, as all students will be dismissed at noon on 9/12/23 with no afternoon bus service for either district. Aftercare will remain open for their usual hours, however, only students who are enrolled and use aftercare on a regular day-to-day basis will be able to be accommodated. # August 15, 2023 Start of School Tidbits-Volume 2

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In today's volume you will find important information about arrival and dismissal. We will start the first day of school with no busing from either of our two districts. There are maps included for how to arrive in the morning and the afternoon. Please take the time to look these maps over. In the afternoon we use an App for pick up called "Pikmykid". There are instruction sheets for how to set this up and designate how your children are going home. Please be advised that you must select where the children are going right out of the classroom; examples (bus, car, aftercare). Our youngest children need to be guided by staff so that they arrive in the correct place.

There is no busing provided by either district for preschool children. You will receive your "car tags" at supply drop off.

During the first week or so I ask for you to be patient, kind, and understanding. We have over 50 new families that have to learn the drop off and pick up system. 120 is a difficult road on a good traffic day, and there are construction projects in the area that will impact the volume on this road. Leave earlier, be considerate of our neighbors behind us, drive slowly in their neighborhood and do not block driveways. Staff are here to help, please be considerate even when you might be frustrated. It really takes about a week until everyone will get the hang of it, and drop off and pick up will be a breeze!
